A reunion theme on Thursday will honor the first National IFYE Conference, held at a 4-H camp in the northern Black Hills in 1952. Special recognition will honor those who attended that first Conference, the 2001 alumni celebrating their first anniversary, the 1977 and 1978 participants celebrating 25 years, and the 1952 and 1953 alumni celebrating their 50th anniversaries. The 1953 and 1978 alumni are being recognized since there will be no National Conference in 2003 due to the World IFYE Conference in Sweden.

Thursday will also include workshops and area meetings. One workshop will be on a



nearby working ranch. To end the day, conferees will attend the famous outdoor Black Hills Passion Play.

Friday morning gets underway with a late breakfast, and departure for an "almost" all-day tour to the southern Black Hills. The new year is well underway, memories are still vivid related to 9/11, the Winter Olympics inspired us all, 2002 Association dues are due, the Impact 2002 campaign continues, final plans are underway for the 50th Anniversary National IFYE Conference in South Dakota, the Futuring Conference is nearing, and we are concerned with the drop in 2002 IFYE applicants.

President Bush's State of the Union message regarding a new USA Freedom Corps (see related article on page 5) with the goal for each American to volunteer 4,000 hours in a lifetime, provides a challenge to all—including the IFYE Association, the 4-H program, and the Extension system.

The 4-H International Programs Futuring Conference, sponsored by the IFYE Association, provides an opportunity to begin the process. Your input is welcome and encouraged. We can determine the involvement of the IFYE Association. The Extension system must determine the direction and involvement of 4-H in crosscultural and international programming and the extent to which it will coordinate and financially support these programs.

Due to 9/11 and the economy, the IFYE program, as with other organizations, has experienced a significant decrease in applicants for 2002. We have 19 US IFYE Representative applicants (14 for the 6-month program; five for 3month) and four for the IFYE Ambassador summer program. We have over 50 inbound participants, based on country agreements and the anticipated number of US participants. This will have a major impact on program finances.

The Impact 2002 campaign is off to a good start, but the \$15,000 it has produced so far is not near the amount needed each year to provide a consistent and adequate base for annual programs. Current annual budgets are based on contributions of \$50,000 + to keep US applicant fees at reasonable levels. I encourage you to pay your Association dues (see article on page 3 by Ron Petrak, IA-Ireland 1953 and Jim Morgan, IA-Switzerland 1975, Past President) and to contribute to Impact 2002!

Celebrations are in order! We salute the year groups being

recognized at the national Conference in South Dakota and those who attended the first IFYE Conference in South Dakota in 1952.

Pictured with me at left are three fellow 1953 IFYEs (I-r): Bonnie Everling Glass, WY-Germany, Lorna Paine Qazi, CO-Germany, and Stan Dreyer, CO-Ecuador. Stan is president of the IFYE Foundation. All four look forward to our "50th" celebration as 1953 IFYEs during this year's Conference in South Dakota, and to a large 1953 contingent celebrating our actual 50th at the World Conference in Sweden in 2003!

An Ode to America, from Romania

Our guest editorial is from a Romanian newspaper editorial received through "Bob," a friend of a friend:

Why are Americans so united? They don't resemble one another! They speak all the languages of the world and form an astonishing mixture of civilizations. Some of them are nearly extinct, others are incompatible, and in matters of religious beliefs, not even God can count how many they are.

Still, the American tragedy turned three hundred million people into a hand put on the heart. Nobody rushed to accuse the White House, the army, the secret services that they are only a bunch of losers. Nobody rushed to empty their bank accounts. Nobody rushed on the streets nearby to gape about.

The Americans volunteered

to donate blood and to give a helping hand. After the first moments of panic, they raised the flag on the smoking ruins, putting on T-shirts, caps and ties in the colors of the national flag. They placed flags on buildings and cars as if in every place and on every car a minister or the president was passing. On every occasion they started singing their traditional song, "God Bless America!"

Silent as a rock, I watched the charity concert broadcast on Saturday. There were Clint Eastwood, Robert de Niro, Julia Roberts, Cassius Clay, Bruce Springsteen, and others whom no film or producers could ever bring together. The Americans' solidarity spirit turned them into a choir. Actually, choir is not the word. What you could hear was the heavy artillery of the American soul.

I watched the live broadcast and the rerun of its rerun for hours listening to the story of the guy who went down one hundred floors with a woman in a wheelchair without knowing who she was, or of the Californian hockey player, who fought with the terrorists and prevented the plane from hitting a target that would have killed other hundreds or thousands of people.

How on earth were they able to bow before a fellow human? Imperceptibly, with every word and musical note, the memory of some turned into a modern myth of tragic heroes. And with every phone call, millions and millions of dollars were put in a collection aimed at rewarding not



a man or a family, but a spirit which nothing can buy.

What on earth can unite the Americans in such a way? Their land? Their galloping history? Their economic power? Money? I tried for hours to find an answer, humming songs and murmuring phrases which risk of sounding like common places.

I thought things over, but I reached only one conclusion.

Only freedom can work such miracles! ★

Ohio Plans European Study Tour

"Young people, ages 13-21, will visit the Europe that tourists rarely see," writes Mary Lynn Thalheimer, manager of the Ohio 4-H International program. The program will take place between June 24 and July 13. Ohio will host a group from Denmark in 2003.

The study tour will take them by train through Switzerland, Germany, Austria, France, The Netherlands and Denmark. In Denmark, they will live with host families and learn about the Danish 4-H program. Prior to the experience itself, the participants will have an extensive orientation program, including a study of architecture, art, natural environment, government, social systems, family life, agriculture, culture, politics and history of Europe, and basic Danish language training



language training. Ohio 4-H conducts an

active 4-H International program each year. In addition to the study tour, Ohio participates in the Labo month-long and year-long programs and the IFYE Ambassador and Representative exchanges. 4-H International County Coordinators (ICCs)

4-H International programs in Ohio are managed through 4-H "International County Coordinators" (ICCs), one in each county. The ICCs lead and guide the international programs in their counties in coordination with their county Extension agents and Thalheimer. They participate in an ICC Training Conference at Ohio State University in January of each year. ★

President Proposes USA Freedom Corps

President George W. Bush called for a significant increase in national service and volunteerism is his State of the Union address on January 29. The goal: each American to volunteer 4,000 hours in a lifetime through one of the USA Freedom Corps programs.

The plan calls for doubling the number of AmeriCorps and Peace Corps volunteers with some of the latter helping in the reconstruction of Afghanistan. It will include a sizable increase in the Senior Corps and the establishment of a Citizens Corps.

A new USA Freedom Corps Council will make recommendations for "additional service opportunities" and "incentives and information" to encourage service.
