

Amazon Smiles

Well, for many of us it is VERY simple. If you shop at Amazon.com, sign in as normal and click on "Amazon Smiles". Amazon Smiles is the section of Amazon that lets you choose where you would like to make your donation; there is NO additional cost to you!! For each purchase made, Amazon will make a small percentage of that sale as a donation to your favorite charity. The IFYE Association of the USA, Inc. is the charity we hope you select! With each purchase you make, you will be making a donation to the IFYE Association of the USA, Inc.! Otherwise, the money goes back to Amazon for them to donate as they prefer; but, IFYE would prefer that the money go to support IFYE Programming!!

You can go into your Amazon account at any time, then into Amazon Smiles to set up IFYE as your charitable non-profit. When you return to do some shopping, just make certain that Amazon Smiles notes your selection and your donation will be recorded. Twice a year, Amazon will directly deposit all of the donations into a specific IFYE Association of the USA, Inc. account. Remember that many hands make small work - just as many small donations combined make happy IFYEs!!

The Internet Helps Outbounds Raise Funds via "crowd sourcing"

Many of you have heard of and perhaps even participated in "crowdfunding" or "crowd sourcing", and some of you are asking, "What in the world is that?" Crowdfunding and crowd sourcing are websites set up for individuals or organizations to raise funds, usually for a one-time specific purpose. Often, when there is a personal or family tragedy, someone will set up a site to assist with medical bills, help build a home destroyed by fire or assist with basic needs of an individual or family. One specific site that is very well known is "Go Fund Me" or more accurately "GoFundMe". This is one of the oldest and best known crowdfunding sites. It allows persons to raise money for a specific purpose and one of those purposes is to be an Outbound IFYE.

Through the oversight of the National Program Director, selected outbound IFYEs are given some basic information on how to set up the site and specifics on what it should contain. Then the selected outbound IFYE is responsible for setting up their own GoFundMe site, if they are interested in doing so.

What are the benefits of the GoFundMe site? Each person can tell their own story about why they want to be an IFYE along with their goals and expectations. They can publicize this through their own Facebook page, other social media and through letting their 4-H, FFA, or college friends know in person. Then, friends and family can make donations online. There is no charge to those who are donating and people can make small or large donations via credit cards. The GoFundMe site will direct deposit the money into an account for the outbound IFYE and retain a small percentage for providing the service. Along with the donation, there is

a list of those who have donated with their contact data for sending thank you notes.

This is a new way of raising funds for outbound IFYEs. More traditional methods are still encouraged, but the youth of today are so tied to social media and technology that many of them find this opportunity to be a much better fit. Therefore, if you know an outbound IFYE, you may be getting a request from them to help sponsor or support their exchange program through "GoFundMe"!! We are pretty certain they would still be happy to accept a check or cash from you as well!!
